

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What are the responsibilities of the NCCPT Facility Supervisor?

A: The NCCPT Facility Supervisor is responsible for assigning the CPT facility visit times and tasks, answering questions, providing critique and feedback and completing short CPT evaluations every other week to the NCCPT.

Q: How much time will the NCCPT Facility Supervisor be expected to dedicate to the CPT?

A: The NCCPT Facility Supervisor will be expected to spend no more than two hours per week supervising the CPT.

Q: Will I have the opportunity to interview a CPT candidate prior to assignment?

A: Yes, you will have the opportunity to interview all candidates prior to placement. In addition, you will have the opportunity to remove an CPT at any stage in the NCCPT program, if necessary.

Q: Can I hire a CPT before the 8-week program is completed?

A: Yes, you can hire the CPT at any stage of the 8-week NCCPT program. However, we encourage you to allow the CPT to complete the program prior to hire.

Q: Will the CPT be NCCPT certified prior to beginning the NCCPT program?

A: Yes, a prerequisite for the NCCPT is that the CPT has passed their NCCPT Certified Personal Trainer exam.

Q: How many CPTs can I have at one time?

A: There is no limit to how many CPT's you can have in your facility at any given time. You will always have the opportunity to accept or reject CPT candidates regardless of how many CPT's are currently in your facility(s).

Q: Can I have to have my CPT work with paying personal training clients?

A: Yes, your CPT can work with, and provide service to, personal training clients and general members alike.
